Thanks for sharing that with us, Chris. On the whole I think it is pretty even handed. I've long felt that if we tried to establish the idea of "library" now--people pool their money and buy one copy of a book or record or videotape and they all share its use--we'd be sued for copyright violation so fast our heads would swim. Publishers would whine that their rights to the fruits of their labor were being violated--ignoring the fact that many authors who actually slaved over the article get no compensation for it while the publishers get all the profit and the professors can't even give copies of the article to their students to read without paying the publishers. Publishers are in the game of making money--as much as they can, as long as they can, and as often as they can--with not one iota of concern for the free flow of information, sparking creative thought, advancement of knowledge, and all the other good things that our high minded founders were so interested in that they actually enshrined libraries' copyright privileges in the Constitution. Let's hope we can continue to combat their efforts to make us look like wild-eyed radicals for wanting to let little kids read, poor people find information, and those that can't afford their own copy of every book or journal we might need or want to use to continue using the libraries.

A new version of the NLM Gateway <http://gateway.nlm.nih.gov/gw/Cmd> was just released. Changes include the following:

* A new system in the Locker and Preferences features (which require a login) was introduced to help users who forget their password. Current and new users are asked to provide a question and an easy-to-remember answer. If you forget your password, the question is displayed. If you enter the correct answer to the question, the password is displayed.

* The background for the search box was changed to match the background of the results summary box.

* The link colors were changed to the web browser default colors.

* The Unique Identifier (UI) was removed from the default brief display for all collections.

* Training manuals that include the NLM Gateway are available for download at http://www.nlm.nih.gov/pubs/web_based.html and links were added to the Gateway Help and Contact Us web pages.
