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Executive Summary

STAFFING UPDATES:

In November the Network Services Coordinator position description was revised to include advocacy and liaison responsibilities to librarians, particularly hospital librarians. As a result, the title was changed to Network and Advocacy Coordinator. The position was re-advertised and in December, three more candidates were invited for interviews. Michelle Burda was offered the position and began employment on January 16, 2012. Ms. Burda has spent the past 17 years in a hospital library, first as a medical librarian, then as library Director. Her most recent position was as reference and consumer health librarian at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center Shadyside hospital.

In December, Barbara Epstein, Lydia Collins, Kate Flewelling, Missy Harvey, Tristan Lucchetti and Renae Barger attended the new staff orientation at the National Library of Medicine.

OUTREACH:

MAR participated in a number of outreach activities this quarter.

MAR staff exhibited on behalf of NLM at an International meeting of the American Society of Nephrology held in Philadelphia, PA. Additionally, MAR demonstrated resources at two regional exhibits, the New York Library Association annual meeting held in Saratoga Springs, NY and the New York City School Library Association annual conference.

Ms. Barger was invited to present at the following regional meetings: NY/NJ Chapter of the Medical Library Association; Brooklyn, Queens, Staten Island, Manhattan and the Bronx Health Sciences Librarians Meeting (BQSI/MB) and the Metro Hospital Library Services Program. Ms. Collins was invited to present at the Medical and Scientific Librarians meeting (MEDLI). These presentations provided opportunities to introduce MAR programs and upcoming funding opportunities, and obtain feedback from 115 hospital and academic librarians.

Formal training consisted of:

- Advanced PubMed and MedlinePlus for Mental Health: taught to public and health sciences librarians, Monmouth, NJ. (Barger)
- Consumer Health Resources for K-12: taught to New York City school librarians, NY, NY (Collins)
- PubMed, Drug Information Portal, MedlinePlus and using MedlinePlus Connect: taught to a practicing, unaffiliated mental health providers, Newark, DE (Flewelling)
- NLM Consumer Health Resources: taught to Greater Pittsburgh area YMCA organizations, Pittsburgh, PA (Collins)
- In late January, Ms. Flewelling introduced two Moodle courses to Network members: Nursing on the Net: Health Care Resources You Can Use and Patient Safety Resource Seminar: Librarians on the Front Lines.

MAR also hosted the MLA Webinar, "Connecting E-science and Team Science: The Changing Nature of Research," at the University of Pittsburgh, Falk Library and had 17 attendees from the Pittsburgh area.

MAR hosted a lecture by Samuel Watson on "Global Health in a Wartime Setting—Iraq," This event was held in conjunction with the National Library of Medicine's traveling exhibit, "Against the Odds: Making a Difference in Global Health."

Susan Barnes and Cindy Olney from the Outreach Evaluation Resource Center visited MAR and offered the CE course, "Valuing Your Library: Needs Assessment, Program

Development, and Program Evaluation” at the University of Pittsburgh Falk Library of the Health Sciences to 15 local Network members and MAR staff.

MAR staff was busy promoting NN/LM services and membership; obtaining feedback to help direct programming; and providing onsite demonstrations of NLM databases during regional site visits. Staff visited:

- 2 resource libraries
- 3 hospital libraries
- 5 public libraries
- 8 community-based or faith-based organizations
- 4 public health or mental health departments

In January 2012, Ms. Barger, Ms. Collins and Ms. Flewelling participated on a conference call with the Monroe County Department of Public Health and the Rochester Public Library. Both organizations are in the Middle Atlantic Region, but not NN/LM Network members. These organizations received funding for a public health/public library partnership funded through the Disaster Information Management Research Center (DIMRC). This call allowed MAR staff to learn more about the DIMRC-funded project as well as introduce benefits of NN/LM membership and services provided by the regional medical library. Shortly after, both parties registered as affiliate members. Ms. Collins and Ms. Flewelling followed by identifying and sending a listing of online disaster information resources to benefit public health workers and the public to both organizations.

FUNDING:

Major projects funded this quarter include:

- Health Sciences Library Association of New Jersey to support their continued efforts to provide MAR hospital libraries with an affordable group licensing plan, “Health Sciences Library Association of New Jersey Group Licensing Initiative 2,” project period November 1, 2011-April 30, 2012.
- University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill to support the Value of Libraries Study, “Value of Library and Information Services in Patient Care Study Analysis and Data Archiving,” project period December 1, 2011-April 30, 2012.

MAR staff reviewed and scored 38 applications for year one projects with funding amounts less than, or equal to \$10,000: 26 applications for Technology Improvement; 7 applications for Outreach to Consumers; 4 applications for Outreach to Health Professionals and 1 application for New Roles for Information Professionals. Of these, 21 were awarded funding with a performance period December 1, 2011-April 30, 2012. MAR staff is assigned to closely monitor subcontractors for timely invoicing and project reports to ensure completion before April 30, 2012.

DOCLINE training was provided on an individual basis to 2 Network members. Consultation was also provided to a new librarian assuming ILL responsibilities at Brooklyn Hospital Center, NY.

Ms. Barger sent out a call for volunteers to participate on focus groups surrounding NLM's strategic plan on the future of resource sharing. From these communications, 42 participants, both Library Directors and ILL librarians, from a variety of library settings were identified to participate.

Update on MARDelivery:

Three new MARDelivery applications were received. Ms. Harvey and Ms. Barger consulted Angie Zack, University of Pittsburgh, Health Sciences Library System (HSLs) Web and Application Programmer, regarding open source programs to serve MARDelivery functions. Some of these have been identified and testing is underway. Additionally, Ms. Harvey is arranging focus groups with a selection of the 70 MARDelivery subscribers to discuss features of the system they would like migrated.

OTHER NOTABLE PROJECTS:

In January, MAR contracted with Cindy Olney, Evaluation Consultant, to develop, pilot, administer and analyze results of two questionnaires to assess the needs of MAR Network members, one for libraries and one for other organizations. MAR staff continues to work with Ms. Olney on finalizing items for these questionnaires. The MAR Network member renewal drive will also be incorporated into this assessment project.

HSLs programmers and staff are also working with MAR staff to develop a social networking platform for the NN/LM Middle Atlantic Region. This platform will foster professional relationships and shared interests among MAR Network members. Data will be collected at an individual level as opposed to an institutional level.

Network Infrastructure

Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) activities

In January, MAR put out the call for Network members to volunteer for the Regional Advisory Committee or one of four Special Advisory Groups. Members will be identified by February, with one in-person meeting of each group to take place before April 30, 2012.

Evidence Based Health

Five professional development awards were funded for Network librarians to attend, "Systematic Review Workshop: the Nuts and Bolts for Librarians" offered by the Health Sciences Library System, University of Pittsburgh on November 7, 2011 through November 9, 2011.

One professional development award was funded for a Network librarian to attend the April 2012 offering of "Systematic Review Workshop: the Nuts and Bolts for Librarians."

Albert Einstein College of Medicine received a professional development award to host an 8-hour CE course, "EBM and the Medical Librarian" taught by Connie Schardt. This course was attended by 23 librarians in the NYC area.

The "Health Sciences Library Association of New Jersey Group Licensing Initiative 2" project, which was funded in this quarter, has the ultimate goal of providing all MAR hospital libraries with affordable electronic access to evidence-based medicine resources.

Assessment and evaluation activities/data

MAR program presentations have been given to 115 Network members. Each presentation includes a feedback and discussion section. Additionally, feedback has been obtained during each site visit.

MAR staff attended "Valuing Your Library: Needs Assessment, Program Development, and Program Evaluation" taught by Susan Barnes and Cindy Olney from the Outreach Evaluation Resource Center.

MAR staff also spent a day with Ms. Barnes and Ms. Olney discussing evaluation priorities specific to the MAR 2011-2016 contract.

Institute for Family Health, "Evaluating MedlinePlus Connect 2," The project team has developed the list of data elements and an associated analytical approach for determining patterns of linking to MedlinePlus. This data will enable the analysis of one full year of MedlinePlus Connect use among patients at The Institute for Family Health. Additionally, patient recruitment for the qualitative component of the study will begin in February.

Health Sciences Library Association of New Jersey, "Health Sciences Library Association of New Jersey Group Licensing Initiative 2," The consultant has been working with vendors to secure package pricing for 2012-2013 renewal year. Programming is underway on a database to manage orders and eventually automate the ordering process. And, a marketing plan is being developed to promote to MAR hospital libraries.

At this point, the best option for Qatar seems to be to request materials through Weill Cornell's NYC location. This can be done either via Loansome Doc or a borrowing account set up in Cornell's ILLiad system for

Qatar.
