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Executive summary

This quarter we began work on an audit of our Network Members, renewing membership and updating contact information for the Membership Directory. We developed an online membership application and determined a way to use the DOCLINE structure to record information about services provided by our community-based organizations and our other non-library members. We also conducted a systematic review of data components within DOCLINE system – this affects Membership directory and ultimately the accuracy of Network data, thus affecting the ability of Network members to communicate with one another.

Agreements were finalized with Idaho State University, University of Alaska Anchorage, and Oregon Health & Science University via Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) for designated state-wide outreach and network development in their states.

We received 8 subcontract proposals from 3 states in response to the RFP announced in July. Upon a complete evaluation of the applications, including input from 3 external reviewers, we recommended NLM approval to fund 3 subcontracts for community and health professional outreach projects in Washington and Montana.

Funding for new Electronic Document Delivery Awards and for a MedlinePlus Go Local project was announced on our web site.

Acknowledging Medical Librarians Month in October, we developed a letter from Director Sherri Fuller to hospital administrators about the value of library services, and offered to send it, at the request of library network members. There were 18 requests from hospital libraries in the region. We also nominated three hospital librarian projects for NLM to highlight during National Medical Librarians Month.

The PNR staff hosted joint presentations and exhibits with NN/LM PSR staff at the MLA Western Chapters meeting.

Gail Koume continued to work with Karen Hajarian about collaboration with Parish Nurse groups. Gail also gave a presentation for the Parish Nurse Preparation Course at Carroll College in Helena, Montana.
