## Overview of ROC and Annual Goals

- Region 6 Executive Committee and Advisory Committees will assist the RML in pushing resources and awareness about the NNLM into the community.
- Teach health professionals and librarians more about their roles in providing equitable access to high quality health information and data.
- Work with regional partners to bring NLM resources to healthcare professionals, especially nurses, physicians, allied health professions, and community researchers.
- Engage libraries to ensure that communities have access to quality and culturally appropriate health information.
- Provide training workshops on big data, data management and data visualization.
- Expand the network membership model to include data organizations.
- Fund awards that improve access to quality online health information resources and data.
- Develop a network of public librarians and community organizations to support the goals of the NNLM All of Us Partnership.
- Conduct site visits to current and potential All of Us library partners; and offer consultation and training to increase awareness and capacity of public library staff about health information skills and programming.
- Promote National Health Observances and Collaborative Summer Library Reading Program resources through existing communication strategies.
- Develop outreach programs through subaward agreements.


