The goals of the NNLM *All of Us* Community Engagement Network are to help public libraries in supporting the health information needs of their users by providing health information training for public library staff, funding and other resources to support health programming and activities, and connections to medical libraries and other NNLM members in their area.

About NNLM

The National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NNLM) is the core of NLM's outreach program comprising eight (8) regions led by Regional Medical Libraries.

The mission of the Network is to advance the progress of medicine and improve the public health by providing all U.S. health professionals with equal access to biomedical information and improving the public's access to information to enable them to make informed decisions about their health.

About NNLM *All of Us*

The mission of the NNLM *All of Us* National Program is to improve consumer access to high quality health information in communities throughout the U.S., specifically, by working with public libraries.

Located in the NNLM's Greater Midwest Region at the University of Iowa, the *All of Us* Community Engagement Network will develop activities that will be responsive and tailored to provide value-added services for public libraries and public library staff, such as health information credentialing, resources for programming, and funding opportunities.
